Composer – American melody, 1852



The words for this hymn first appeared in the February 1862, issue of The Atlantic Monthly magazine and were published as the Civil War battle song of the Republic. The author, Julia Ward Howe, received the grand total of five dollars for his literary efforts. Mrs. Howe and the doctor husband had recently moved from Boston to Washington, D.C., where he was involved in medical service for the government. Julia became deeply anguished as she noted the growing angry mood of the nation and its frenzied preparation for the tragic war between the northern and southern states.

Day after day Mr. Howe watched the troops go by as they marched off to war and heard them sing the strains of "John Brown's Body" named for self-styled abolitionist who was hanged for his efforts to have the slave freed.



JOHN DAVIS



The year was 1972. Richard Nixon was elected the 37th President of the United States. The Watergate scandal was revealed to the public. One of the greatest hits, "Papa Was A Rolling Stone" was released by the Temptations, The first National Black Political Convention (NBPC) was held in Gary, Indiana, Sammy Davis Jr. became the first African-American to host the Academy Awards... and John Davis joined the Jubilee Majestic Concert Choir - a journey that continues til this day.

A native Washingtonian, John grew in Southeast, DC, attending Birney Elementary, Douglass Jr. High (where he played clarinet and saxophone in the school's band) and Ballou High School. While at Ballou John was a member of the military band the newly formed Ballou Gospel Choir. John also attended American University.

In 1966, at the age of 14, John joined Mt. Jezreel Baptist Church (MJBC). He was baptized the late Reverend Dr. Harold Trammell. As

a child John served as President of the Junior Usher Board, Vice President of the Junior Choir and Librarian of Sunday School and became a Trustee at at the age of 19, where he served as Chairman of Transportation for more than twenty years. As Trustee John over-sought the purchase of four 15-passenger van. He also served as Trustee Liaison with the music department, responsible for the purchase of pianos, drums and other equipment. John also sang with Jezreelites and MJBC Mass Choir.

In 2006, John join Stephen Baptist Church (SSBC), serving on many ministries, including Trustee for a short time, overseeing several beautification projects, including the painting of the sanctuary. John assisted with the purchase of the church's three buses and one box truck. He helped create the graphic design for the SSBC vehicles. Some of the many duties John took on involved in included driving one of the buses for the Senior's Ministry (over 15 years), serving on the Board of Directors for SSBC's 501(3)(c) ministry, Project Bright Future mentoring program.

In 1972, John officially became a Majestic. Recalling his journey, from rehearsing in basement of Sister Alberta Bryant, mother of several former Majestics, to the numerous engagements, anniversaries and summer tours. After a serious injury sidelined John for a period time he returned in 2000 and remains an active member today, of course with Continued on page 9


some added responsibilities. He is the captain of the Bass section, member of the Board of Directors and the choir's treasurer.

One day while witnessing a parade of soldiers singing this catch tone, a visiting friend and her former pastor, the rev. James Freeman Clarke of Boston, turned to Mrs. Howe and said, "Why don't you write some decent words for that tone?" "I will," answered Mrs. Howe, and the words came to her that same evening. She has left the following account: I awoke in the grey of the morning, and as I lay waiting for dawn, the long lines of the desired poem began to entwine themselves in my mind, and I said to myself, "I must get up and write these verses, lest I fall asleep and forget them! So, I sprang out of bed and in the dimness found an old stump of a pen, which I remembered using the day before. I scrawled the verse almost without looking at the paper.

Soon the entire nation was united in singing "Mine eyes have seen the glory of the coming of the Lord..." rather than many derisive phase coined about "John Brown's Body." Julia Ward Howe's text, written in response to a challenge to make better words for an existing Southern American camp meeting tune, was destined for immortality.Chicago considering Maior Whittle's invitation to replace Bliss as Whittle's song leader in his future evangelistic endeavors. The hymn had a great spiritual impact when it was first introduced to a large tabernacle audience in Chicago as Major Whittle related how the text had been found among Bliss's belongings. He told how James McGranahan had composed the music for this text and how that this musician would not continue the work begun by Bliss.
